After obtaining an MA in history, he joined the Canadian Foreign Service and gradually rose from junior diplomatic positions in Karachi and Kuala Lumpur to Ambassador in Jakarta and Beijing. As well, he served as a senior Canadian representative to the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) in Paris and the World Bank in Washington, DC. Interspersed with his overseas postings were senior positions in Ottawa as Assistant Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs and Vice-President in the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA).

He is now retired in Vancouver where he is Honorary Professor in Residence at the Institute of Asian Research at UBC. He has published his memoirs, A Stubble Jumper in Striped Pants: Memoirs of a Prairie Diplomat (University of Toronto Press, 1999) and Gayatri Rajapatni: Perempuan di Balik Kejayaan Majapahit (Yogyakarta, Ombak 2012). His first published book was Regina The Queen City [McClelland & Stewart, 1955]).
